Wellness Exam Recommended yearly

Includes complete exam with oral exam.

Equine Vaccines

Adult Horses:

Annually: Tetanus, EE's, West Nile, Rabies, Potomac Horse Fever, +/- Strangles

Biannually: +/-Rhino/Influenza, +/-Potomac Horse Fever

Quarterly: +/-Rhino/Influenza in boarded/show horses

Broodmares:

Vaccinate 3-6 weeks prior to foaling

Rhino at 3,5,7,9 months pregnancy

Foals:

Mare was vaccinated prior to foaling:

6 months: all vaccines, booster in one month. Vaccines may be staggered by 2 weeks to reduce immune system overload

Mare was not vaccinated prior to foaling:

Day1: tetanus antitoxin and vaccine

1 month: tetanus vaccine

4 months: all vaccines, booster in one month. Vaccines may be staggered by 2 weeks to reduce immune system overload.

Equine Fecal

Perform a Fecal Egg Count per veterinary instructions. Typically this will be at least twice yearly.

Equine Deworming

We prefer to base deworming decisions on fecal egg count results. This prevents overuse of dewormers leading to parasites that are resistant to deworming medications. Talk to the veterinarian for a plan.

If a routine deworming program is chosen anyway, then rotate dewormers every time.

An example: Start any time of year anywhere in rotation

1. Panacur
2. Ivercide
3. Strongid
4. Anthelcide
5. Zimectrin
